

A Note on language Green Jargon Buster

3Rs – reduce, reuse, recycle.

Active travel – walking and cycling to get around.

Air source heat pump – a pump that takes heat out of the air to heat a building (the reverse of an air conditioning unit).

Best if used By Before date indicates when a product will be of best flavour or quality.

Bioaccumulation – where toxins taken up by plants and animals from their environment become concentrated in body tissues.

Biodegradable – a material that breaks down with the assistance of micro-organisms.

Biodiversity – all the living things in an area (plants, animals, fungi, microbes).

Carbon footprint – the carbon emissions of a person or organisation or product over a given time.

Carbon neutral – making no net release of carbon dioxide into the atmosphere especially because of carbon offsetting.

CCC – Committee on Climate Change – committee of scientists that advises the United Kingdom (UK) government on climate policy.

Circular economy – the production of products that can be recycled and reused.

Climate change – the heating of the earth's atmosphere by the accumulation of greenhouse gases.

Compostable – a material that breaks down to make soil.

COP27 – the 27th meeting of all the countries signed up to the United Nations (UN) Convention on Climate Change (the Conference of the Parties) 1st one was held in Berlin 1995.

Degradable – a material that breaks down by chemical reactions.

Emissions – gases that are given off as the result of a chemical reaction.

Energy Performance Certificate (EPC) – a rather inaccurate measure of how well insulated and energy efficient a building is (G is low and A is high).

Fossil fuel – coal, oil, or gas. Any hydrocarbon fuel that gives off carbon dioxide when burnt. Fossil because these fuels were laid down from plants living many millions of years ago.

Global warming – the heating of the planet earth by gases in the atmosphere trapping heat from the sun instead of allowing it to escape back into space.

Greenhouse gases – the gases in the earth's atmosphere that trap heat around the planet (as in a greenhouse), the most common is carbon dioxide, but there is also water vapour, methane, ozone, and nitrous oxide.

Greenwashing – Spending more time and money claiming to be "green" through advertising rather than minimizing business environmental impact.

Ground source heat pump – a pump that takes heat from the ground to heat a building.

Heavy metal – metals with relatively high densities that can be very damaging in the environment.

IPCC – Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change – is the international group of scientists that supplies the scientific background to the UN Convention on Climate Change.

Landfill – sites where rubbish is disposed of in the ground – they often generate methane and can pollute local water courses.

LEDs – light emitting diodes – low energy lightbulbs.

Low traffic neighbourhoods – urban areas where

Net zero carbon – is all about 'balancing' or cancelling out any carbon emissions produced.

through flow of traffic is discouraged.

National grid – is the cable network that moves electricity around the UK. It needs to deliver the supply at 240 volts.

Net zero is reached when the amount of greenhouse gas produced is no more than the amount taken away (usually by offsetting).

Offsetting – removal of carbon emissions from the atmosphere – often by tree planting.

Offshore wind – turbines that generate electricity from the wind and are sited in the sea

Onshore wind – turbines that generate electricity from the wind and are sited on land.

Organic food – food that is produced with no artificial chemical or animal product inputs.

Passive house – a house that is very well insulated and completely draught proof and may not require any heating at all.

Pesticide – chemical that kills insects.

Plant-based diet – a plant-based diet is any diet that focuses on foods derived from plant sources. This can include fruit, vegetables, grains, pulses, legumes, nuts, and meat substitutes such as soy products.

Power station – a building that generates electricity (usually by heating water to produce steam to drive a turbine). The fuel can be coal, oil, gas, or uranium/plutonium.

Recycle – use a product at the end of its life to make a new product e.g. glass bottles.

Renewable energy – electricity generation that uses wind, water, or the sun as a fuel.

Repurpose – find a new use for something at the end of its

life or no longer wanted.

Retrofit – work carried out to make an existing house as energy efficient as possible

Solar photo-voltaic (PV) panels – a silicon crystalline panel that converts solar energy into electricity (requires an inverter to convert the direct current (DC) generated to alternating current (AC)).

Sell-by-date marked on a perishable product indicating time by which it should be sold.

Solar thermal water heating – direct heating of domestic water from the sun.

Sustainability – avoidance of the depletion of natural resources to maintain an ecological balance.

Tidal energy – electricity generation from the tidal range.

Use-by date on food – is about food safety. This is the most important date to remember.

Vegan diet – a diet that contains no animal products at all.

Waste stream – waste is generated by domestic and industrial activities and the waste stream represents the life cycle of waste up to and including its eventual disposal.

Water turbine – a turbine that generates electricity by harnessing the movement of water.

Wave energy – electricity generated from wave power.

Wind turbine – a turbine that generates electricity by harnessing the wind.

Zero carbon – the target we are heading for with no emissions of greenhouse gases.

Zero emissions – an engine, motor or other energy source that emits no waste products that pollute the environment or disrupt the climate.

Upcycling – reusing or recycling something in a way that increases the original object's value.

Herbicide – a chemical that kills plants and can be damaging to bees
