

Background to the 13th Annual Carbon Report



- Third report since adopting the Haringey Climate Change Action Plan (HCCAP) in March 2021.
- Reports on:
 - Policy and legislative updates
 - Progress towards 2041 Targets (emissions data from 2021)
 - Relevant carbon reduction projects delivered across the borough in 2023



Borough emissions headlines

- 2015-2021:
 - 17% reduction, primarily driven by the decarbonization of electricity.
 - 40% reduction is needed to remain in the Net Zero pathway.
- 2020-2021: A slight upward trend in emissions by 1.18%
 - attributed to the post-COVID "rebound effect" as lockdown restrictions eased

Council emissions headlines

- 2014/15 to 2022/23: 70% reduction (12,840 tCO2)
- 2021/22 to 2022/23: 3% reduction (114 tCO2)


Consumption-based emissions

New dataset: 23% reduction from 2015 to 2020

Key consumption areas to reduce remain: transport, housing (e.g. building materials), food (at home and outside the home)




13th Annual Carbon Report: Carbon emissions (kt CO2) from 2015 to 2021

Comparison with 2020 data:


• Housing: 3% decrease

Industrial and Commercial:


7.4% increase

NRRM: Same






13th Annual Carbon Report: Haringey's Emissions by Sector from 2015-2021 with HCCAP Target

13th Annual Carbon Report: Progress Against HCCAP Objectives

- 1. Council: 70% reduction in its carbon footprint. Aim is to be net zero council by 2027.
- 2. **Housing**: Borough-wide average SAP: Band D, aim is to reach achieve EPC B on average in all domestic buildings. To tackle this energy efficiency retrofit programmes are on line.
- **3. Workplace**: Reduction by 20.5% overall, but increase of 7.4% increase in 2021 from 2020. Working with businesses to offer advice and grants.
- **4. Transport**: 21.7% reduction overall; a 4.4% increase in 2021. LTNs and school streets expected to show carbon reductions in coming years.
- **5. Energy**: With the council already serving as a heat supplier to approximately 1,700 homes and plans for a broader low-carbon District Energy Network (DEN) in progress.
- **6. Community**: Ongoing active collaboration with stakeholder organisations, promotion of sustainability in the green economy sector, and protection of the borough's biodiversity and habitats.
 - Set up of the Haringey Climate Partnership is underway. Continued support and liaison with stakeholders will be essential for sustained progress in this area.

13th Annual Carbon Report: Projects Delivered in 2023

Report includes updates on:

- Revised governance structures and reporting on <u>climate mitigation and adaption into</u> papers for Cabinet;
- Roll-out of half-day and full-day <u>Carbon Literacy sessions</u> for staff and Cabinet members;
- Construction of highly sustainable new council homes;
- Extension of the <u>School Street Programme</u> and <u>Low Traffic Neighbourhood</u> (LTN) trials;
- Delivery of the <u>Community Carbon Fund</u>;
- Increased the amount of the <u>council's pension fund</u> invested in low carbon technologies and industries;
- Extended plans for retrofit under the <u>Housing Energy Action Plan</u>, and expansion of the council's Energy Advice Programme;
- A new <u>Climate Adaptation and Resilience section</u>, includes work on climate risk mapping and the
 work on preparing for heat waves and flooding;



13th Annual Carbon Report: Community Projects

- The 2023 Go Green Eco Urban Festival events took place in June with a range of stakeholders, attendees and on different sustainability topic areas.
- Friend of the Earth:
 - Lobbied with Haringey's MP for stronger climate action on insulating homes, and domestic gas heating.
 - Contributed to support traffic reduction through LTNs and emission reduction in the ULEZ extension.
 - Looking after trees planted on Dairy Fields in 2021.
 - Working with the council on a new project for Commerce Road.

Growing in Haringey Network:

- Continuation to run plant stalls and seed swaps contributing to community growing spaces.
- Providing small grants for tools, water butts and spring bulbs.
- Working with Black Rootz and Wolves Lane Plant Centre.

En10ergy:

- continued to manage its 4 solar arrays.
- sell electricity at a very discounted price to Woodside School, the M&S store in Muswell Hill and Fortismere School.

Muswell Hill Sustainability Group:

- Organised events on creating garden habitats, preventing overheating and overcooling in homes, hire and repair of household appliances with expert speakers in Jan, April and July.
- Organised more Green Open Home events.
- Green Book Group meetings to discuss newly published titles on green topics.
- Two Green drinks event, one summer celebration and Christmas party.
